Bisley report

20th August 2013

There was a (very) late entry on behalf of Lothian in the County Champion of Champions match at the end of the Bisley Championship meeting in the person of Sinclair Bruce (Balerno & Currie). Sink had not entered the week-long meeting but was available to shoot on the final two days of the meeting (the Friday and Saturday) as well as the Sunday for the CofC match.

His efforts in the qualifying stages on the Friday and Saturday mornings saw him qualify for the Final of the Earl Roberts British Long-range Championship, achieving the highest place in the second stage. In the final stage on Saturday afternoon, Sink finished with a magnificent 3rd place, behind the winner, another Scot Bill Baird originally from Aberdeen but now shooting for Havant in Hampshire.

In the Champion of Champions match the following day, Sink led from the front. In an English match shot on the Malcolm Cooper range, he had the top qualifying score of 591, equal with two others including Bill Vaughan of Scottish Southern Counties, with Cliff Ogle of Forth & Clyde in 4th place three points behind. In the Final, he maintained his lead and finished as the first Lothian shooter to have won this championship. Bill Vaughan was third, giving medals to the only two Scottish entrants. Well done to them both. Cliff Ogle finished 7th after scoring a zero in his first Final shot when he shot fractionally after the Stop command.

In the Home Countries International matches, both Scotland teams came second to England.

NSRA Scottish National Meeting 2013

7th July 2013
(updated 8th July)

Here's a short summary of local shooters' achievements at the 'Scottish' held at Lauder last week:

Sinclair Bruce of Balerno & Currie had a magnificent week, winning many, many competitions and trophies, too numerous to mention here. The most significant were winning both the Squadded and Unsquadded Aggregate competitions. He was disappointed not to cap a fine week's shooting by only coming 2nd in the Earl Haig Scottish Long-range Championship though (won by Tom Hodgson of Dumfries). He also won the SSRA's 'Freuchie' knock-out competition for the impressive Wilkinson Sword.

In Class B, both Adam Dove and Robin Thomson (both Watsonians) did well and showed up in several prize-lists, but shooting in Class D, the standout performer was Rhona Dove, also of Watsonians. In the Unsquadded Aggregate she was 2nd, 3rd and 1st in Competitions 10, 11 and 12, and was runner-up in the Agg. In the Weekend Aggregate, she was 1st, 1st and 2nd in Competitions 1, 7 and 8, and won the overall Agg. Her score in Comp 1 was sufficient to qualify her for the final of the Earl Haig Scottish Long-range Championship where she acquitted herself well. In the Squadded Aggregate, Rhona won Comp 2 and was well placed in the other three competitions, and she finished as runner-up in the Aggregate.

Mention should also be made of Michelle Galea (Balerno & Currie) who was shooting in her first Scottish meeting in her first season shooting outdoors. In Class D, she won one of the Unsquadded Aggregate competition (C10) and was third in another. A great start, Michelle, keep it up!

The Junior championship (under-18) was won by D Gutteridge of George Watson's College, and the under-15 championship was won by S Brown, also of Watson's. The Watson's B team won the Junior team competition.

The Lothian team in the County Sextette competition came 4th. The team was Sinclair Bruce (B&C), Andy Hay (Redcraig), Carl Broughton (Masonic), Ian Thomson, Bev Burnside and Adam Dove (all Watsonians). It was a very windy week, especially on the first Saturday and Sunday, which was reflected in the scores made by some of the team who had to shoot at that time. Watsonians came 2nd in the ICI Cup (100 yards team competition), and their B team won the John Eddie trophy for the team whose members are all in B, C or D class in the ICI competition. In the Pullar Targe (50 metre team competition), Watsonians could do no better than 5th, but their B team again collected the BCD section trophy.

Scotland won the Home Countries International match, beating Wales and England quite comfortably. Sinclair Bruce was the only Lothian representative in the Scotland team.

Watsonians/George Watson's were the only Lothian clubs to enter any teams at this meeting, and despite exhortations from here and there, there were no more than a handful of individual competitors from other clubs in Edinburgh and the Lothians. Maybe next year things might improve as the NSRA confirmed that the 2014 meeting will go ahead and will again be held at Lauder. **In an attempt to boost the entry, the NSRA will shortly announce a 'bounty' scheme similar to the one operating for new NSRA memberships - anyone introducing a new shooter to any of their National Meetings including next year's 'Scottish' will be eligible for some kind of yet-to-be decided bonus/bounty/kickback sort of reward.**

Unrelated to the 'Scottish', but we should also congratulate Sinclair Bruce for qualifying for the Great Britain squad of 12 which travels out to the USA later this month for the every-eight-years match at Camp Perry (Ohio) against our friends across the pond for the Pershing Trophy on 23rd July. We wish him and the team well. There are two other Scots in the GB squad - Graham Shedden (Dumfries) and Richard Simpson (Greenock). The team of 10 will be picked from the squad after the first two days of the Championship meeting at Camp Perry (the US equivalent of our Bisley championships).

Annual General Meeting

12th June 2013

Here's a short summary of the happenings at the recent AGM

1. The Chairman thanked Ian Thomson for stepping in to run three County Teams in the winter leagues.
2. The Treasurer reported a profit over the year which was smaller than the previous year's. He did not recommend any fee increases, but hoped to see an increase in participation in the competitions to increase revenue.
3. A new Constitution was adopted, mainly to bring it up to date in the areas of insurance and the handling of disputes. It is modelled on the NSRA's specimen constitution. A copy will appear on this site in due course.
4. All the existing office-bearers were re-elected, and in addition Brian Atkinson (EU Alumni) was elected as County Captain.
5. A potential site for an outdoor range has been identified near Wallyford. There are still a lot of points to be clarified before it can be taken forward though.

SSRA Inter-Region Matches

22nd May 2013

A team from Lothian travelled to the Denwood ranges in Aberdeen on 14th April to take part in the annual Inter-Region matches run by the SSRA. Here is team manager Ian Thomson's report:

The Inter Regional Match is combined with the All Ranges Shoot in Aberdeen in mid April. The competitions include shooting at 25yds, 50M and 100yds. On the day, the weather was relatively mild with a strong wind which switched quickly from left to right so it was an interesting challenge.

The Inter Regional Match has two sections, one for the Team at 25yds and the second for the Team at 50M & 100yds. The Team is 6 shooters with the best 5 to count. Despite my appeal for Lothians shooters before the competition we only had 5 shooters – all from Watsonians (better than last year). A 6th shooter would have given the Team more depth.

The Team finished 2nd at 25 yds, only 2 points behind Southern Counties, but were a bit further behind at 50M / 100yds due to less experience than the winners. My thanks to all Team members who represented Lothian.

The meeting is designed to attract novices to outdoor shooting as well as the top shooters for the Inter Regional Match. Lothian shooters have the ability to win both matches.

It was great to see Georgia Gooch and Steven Brown from George Watson's as well as Charles Guest and Alasdair Hitchin from Prestonpans travelling to Aberdeen for their first experience of outdoor shooting. The comment from Charles on the journey home was "that was the best days shooting I've ever done – 100yds was fantastic". Let's hope the enthusiasm is infectious and we can attract more Lothian shooters next year.

Team Postal League

18th May 2013

The final round's results have just reached the site administrator, and the winners are now known.

Division 1 was won by Balerno & Currie, for the first time since 2003, only dropping two points with a couple of draws. They were the only unbeaten team in the league. Last year's winners Pentland were runners-up this time.

Division 2 was taken by Selkirk B who were well ahead on points from Redcraig A and had the best average by some margin.

Division 3 was won by Prestonpans in a much tighter division, being only one point ahead of the closest challengers Redcraig B.

The Smith Shield for the best percentage improvement in average from last season's competition was also won by Sinclair Bruce with an improvement of 37.5%

The overall entry was better than last season's but not by much. George Watson' College made entries again after a blank year, which helped boost the Inexpert classes, but that was the only club to enter anyone in the Inexpert A competition.
