<u>The County Sextette team</u> did not fare too well, coming 7th out of nine. Most of the Lothian shooters had to shoot their cards at the weekend when conditions were at their worst. It was won by Aberdeenshire who have won this more times than any other county (Lothian are second in the all-time list).

Licensing of Air Weapons in Scotland

Police Scotland have just issued a statement that from 1st July, members of the public will be able to apply for a licence for any air weapons they hold. From 31st December 2016 it will be an offence to possess an airgun without a licence. There will be an 'amnesty' period where unwanted airguns can be handed in. The dates for that are unclear but will probably not extend into 2017.

More publicity will be given nearer the time with details of the hand-in period and how to apply for a licence. Clubs which practice airgun shooting will also have to register: again, no details have been given about that yet.

Sport Rifle

With the new airgun laws in Scotland approaching fast, local clubs might find that they are contacted by members of the public who own an airgun and want to join a club so that they have a 'good reason' for owning it in order to apply for a licence for it. Most clubs in this area do not have facilities for airgun shooting, but that need not continue to be the case.

It should not be too difficult to adapt an existing 25-yard range to allow Sport Rifle shooting at 20 yards. It just needs a flat place to stand and a purpose-built target holder / pellet catcher. Special supportive clothing is prohibited so it's an easy and inexpensive sport to take up.

Sport Rifle shooting involves shooting standing with either a .177 or .22 air rifle, with or without a scope. This could allow such new members to keep their air rifle and also boost club membership. Competitions are offered by the NSRA as well as other organisations such as the Cumbria & Northumbria TSA. It is already one of the fastest-growing shooting disciplines in the UK but is set to explode in Scotland due to the legislation about to come into force. Clubs might like to be prepared to offer this facility. They should note that if they do they would have to register as an Airgun Club with the police so that 'good reason' is valid.

News has just reached us of the death of Norman Brown, on 6th September. He was 92. He had been in hospital for some time at the start of the year, but settled in well at a nursing home where he had been very happy until his passing.

Norman was heavily involved in all aspects of smallbore shooting in Edinburgh and the Lothians in the post-war period and beyond. He was one of the founders of the L&P Association immediately after the war, and was a member of Eastfield RC in Edinburgh, running the club virtually single-handedly until its disbandment in the 1990's(?). He held office in the 'Home Guard' Association, mainly as General Secretary, for many years, as well as in the LSSA.

Scottish Air Weapons Legislation

12th Sept 2015

It has been announced that the new legislation to licence air guns in Scotland will commence on 1 April 2016. It has also become apparent that people with existing FAC or shot gun certificates will not need to apply for an air gun certificate until their existing section 1 / section 2 certificate is due for renewal.
